Drive Up AwarenessFor Parkinson's Disease Wherever You Go!

The clock is ticking, and we have until March 31, 2022, to get a minimum of 250 vehicles signed up for the statewide "FIGHTING PARKINSON'S DISEASE" car tag.

The PAA will pay the \$50 upfront fee and we will complete the paperwork to reserve your pre-commitment for the Parkinson's Disease license plate. If the minimum pre-commitment is reached by March 31, 2022, you will receive an invoice from the PAA in the amount of \$50. If the minimum pre-commitment is not met, Parkinson's Disease specialty license plates will not be offered in the state of Alabama. PAA will receive \$41.25 for every Fighting Parkinson's Disease license plate purchased and these funds will be used to further the PAA's mission of improving the quality of life for patients, caregivers, and their families affected by Parkinson's Disease in the state of Alabama.

Please contact Bibby Bailey at bibby@parkinsonalabama.org to reserve your pre-commitment for the PAA license plate. You will need to provide your VIN, Make, Model, Vehicle Year, and Tag Number for us to sign you up.

ISOLATED because of age, illness or Covid?

Did you know there is a **Senior Talk Line** available thru the Central Alabama **CRISIS CENTER**? This center serves five counties surrounding Birmingham--Blount County, Jefferson County, St. Clair County, Shelby County and Walker County.

The Senior Talk Line service is a **free telephone reassurance service** for senior citizens, caregivers, retirees, widowed persons, grandparents and others who might find comfort in having a counselor call them on a regular basis to talk.

Seniors are encouraged to talk about anything that is of interest or concern to them. **This program is designed to reduce social isolation.** They understand that sometimes it just helps to have someone to talk with, someone who will listen...and care.

A trained staff or volunteer counselor calls each senior client at least three times a week. Or they may call every day if you prefer.

When you call, you will be asked some very basic questions, such as name, telephone number, age, etc., all of which are kept as confidential background information for our staff and volunteer counselors.

Inflammation in Parkinson's disease (PD)

What are we doing?

Assembling a well-characterized PD/Healthy Control patient population for study with regard to neuroinflammation.

Why are we doing this?

Parkinson's disease (PD) is the second most common neurodegenerative disorder. While current treatments mitigate the symptoms and disability associated with PD, no treatments slow or reverse the neurodegenerative process.

Who are we looking for?

- Individuals 50 years and older
- Individuals with no history of autoimmune conditions or neurological disorders

What do I have to do?

- Complete a series of questionnaires and receive a neurological exam, memory testing, & blood draw
- If eligible and willing, participate in spinal fluid collection and PET/MRI scanning

Will I receive compensation?

You will receive up to \$175 for completion of study activities

Exercise-induced Cognitive Improvement Through Enhanced Sleep in Parkinson's Disease

A new clinical trial at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) is investigating the effects of exercise on sleep and cognition through participation in a supervised exercise program.

Study Groups: All participants in this study will be randomly assigned to one of two groups: 1) Immediate exercise (24 weeks of training)

2) Delayed exercise (12 weeks of training)

Total Study Duration: 24 Weeks

Who Can Participate: At least 45 years old with a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease, on stable medications for at least 4 weeks, and no contraindications to an exercise program.

Study Visits: Participation in the study involves a screening visit and three sets of study assessments (cognitive tests, sleep study, brain MRI), each of which will involve 3-4 study visits to UAB. The sets of study assessments will occur at the beginning of the study, at week 12, and at week 24. There will also be three visits per week for exercise training at UAB's Center for Exercise Medicine.

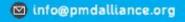

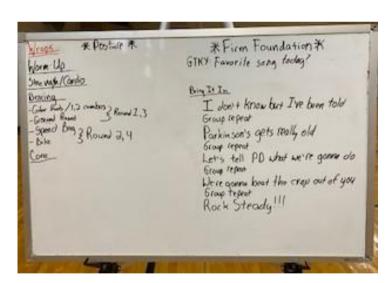
